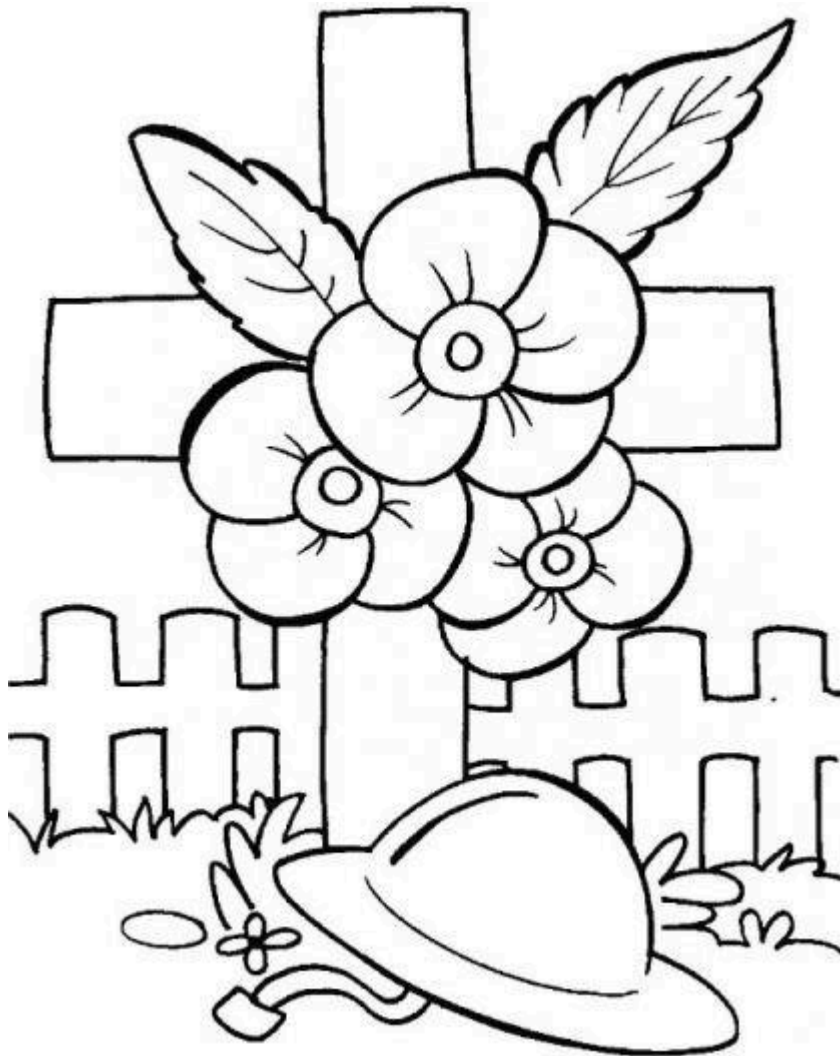

## Remembrance Sunday Colouring Sheet





The First World War ended at 11 am on the 11th November 1918. Since then the 11th November has been known as 'Armistice Day'. Look the word up in a dictionary. At 11 am each year on that day we have two minutes silence to remember all those who died in that war and all wars since. We wear a poppy to show our gratitude for their sacrifice.

In the Second World War, so as not to interfere with war work in factories, the act of remembrance was moved to a Sunday. Since then the main act of remembrance takes place on the second Sunday of November and is known as 'Remembrance Sunday'.
